Foster Care Sewing Project February 23, 2024, 9:00am-3:00pm

One of Fayette County Extension Homemakers most meaningful community contributions is the 'duffle bag' project. Led by Sierra Smith, this program is based upon the need for children to have their own spacious bag to use for moves between placements, personal use, and storage. These kits are precut, so if you can press, pin or sew, your help is definitely needed. These bags will be delivered both locally and statewide. Volunteers can arrive late and/or leave early. There is no charge for all the fun you will have!

Safe Handling of Cooked Rice

Have you ever heard that it's not safe to reheat rice? That may be true if you did not properly cool the cooked rice. Rice, along with other grains, can have spores of the bacteria Bacillus cereus. These spores can survive the cooking process and lead to foodborne illness if the food is not handled properly. Improper cooling or sitting at room temperature for more than two hours can allow spores to germinate and produce a toxin. This toxin is what makes people sick, causing nausea, vomiting, and abdominal cramps.

It is important to keep cooked rice out of the danger zone, 40 degrees F to 140 degrees F. This means that you should keep cooked rice hot (above 140 degrees F) until served and cool any leftovers rapidly to 40 degrees F or below. Do not let rice sit out on the counter. The longer cooked rice is at room temperature, the more likely it is that toxins can make the rice unsafe to eat. Place cooked rice in shallow containers without lids and put immediately in the refrigerator. Once cool, cover the containers and store no more than five days.

You can safely reheat properly cooked and cooled rice in the microwave. Place the rice in a microwave-safe container and add a little water or broth. Cover with a lid so the rice can steam. Heat until the internal temperature of the rice is 165 degrees F. Use a food thermometer to be sure. Discard any leftovers and do not reheat more than once.

February 7, 2024: *The Hard Side of the River: A Novel of Abolition* by Johnny Payne

In the pre-Civil War South, an escaped slave and two young abolitionists make an uneasy pact with a former slave tracker in this gritty historical novel. Maysville, Kentucky, 1833. Thirty years before the War Between the States, schoolteacher Dana Curbstone and preacher Cal Fenton have already begun their private war on the institution of slavery. When they conspire to smuggle escaped slave Jacob Pingram across the Maysville River, Pingram's masters dispatch retired slave tracker Dan Baskin to retrieve their human cargo and bring the abolitionists to justice.

But Baskin has his own war to wage. Pingram knows the whereabouts of another former slave, Abejide. And Baskin is determined to learn the fate of the woman he loved and lost. Now everyone, slave and freeman alike, are hurtling toward an electric showdown on the mud-slick banks of the Maysville River from which nobody will escape unscathed.

Jalapeño Poppers

4 ounces reduced fat cream cheese

1 tablespoon grated Parmesan cheese 1 teaspoon garlic powder

% cup shredded reduced fat mozzarella cheese

8 large jalapeño peppers

8 pieces, thinly sliced bacon, cut in half

Preheat oven to 425 degrees F.
In a small bowl, mix together the
cream cheese, Parmesan cheese,
garlic powder and mozzarella cheese.
Wash peppers and cut off stems.
Cut peppers lengthwise to make 16
halves. You may want to wear plastic
gloves while handling hot peppers.
Scrape out the seeds and membrane
of each pepper. Stuff each pepper
half with the cream cheese mixture
and wrap each stuffed pepper with

a half piece of bacon. Lightly grease a broiler pan or pan with a rack. This will allow any grease to fall away from the poppers. **Bake** for 20 minutes or until poppers are hot and juicy and the bacon is browned.

Yield: 16 servings
